### Introduction

Problems with the Education System within the University have been around for many years. It has become increasingly apparent that the University is unable and unwilling to get to grips with these problems: the two Joint Committee on Academic Standards reports (which looked at why specific groups of students get worse results in Tripos exams), have been pathetically poor in their recommendations and few ideas are being produced by other University bodies. Therefore, it seems that the only way change can be achieved is by the students, through CUSU, creating their own solutions to the problems with Education in the university. These solutions will be written up into a Charter: *the Charter for Change*, which will be presented to the University. By proposing our own sensible, effective and irrefutable solutions to the Education problems within the University, the University will have to listen and lasting change will be achieved.

### **Contents of the Charter**

The Charter will contain proposals for reform in the following areas:

Supervisions
Examinations
Lectures
Library Facilities
Openness within the University and Colleges
Miscellaneous Proposals

### How the Charter will be Submitted

Copies of the Charter will be tailored to each Faculty, College and Department within the University so each body will only receive the information relevant to itself. Each body will then be sent their tailored copy at the start of the 2006-7 Academic Year for discussion. A display copy of the Charter will also be created, hopefully signed by every College JCR and MCR President; the CUSU and GU Presidents and the Student Faculty Board Members. It is hoped that this can be ceremonially presented to the University on the first day of Full Term of Michaelmas 2006.
